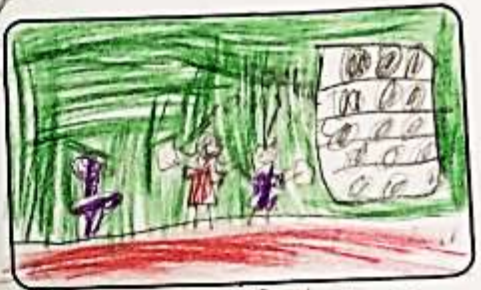

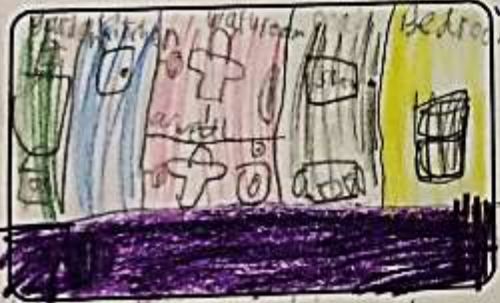
Hi I'm on, something weird happened one day I was wandering in a field when I fell into a puddle & I was going down.

I support Manchester United FC. Do you support a football team?

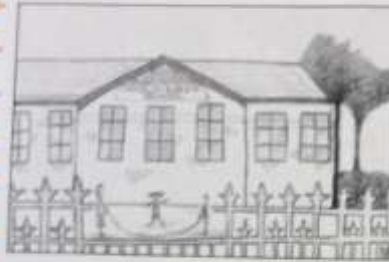
