



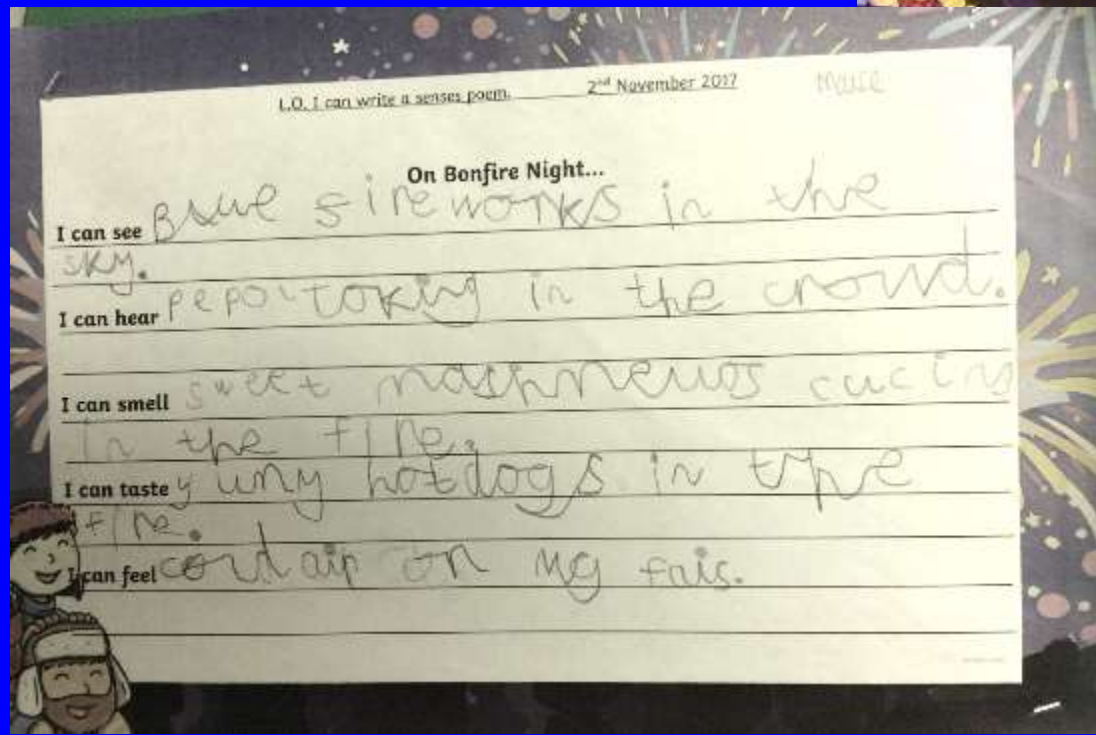
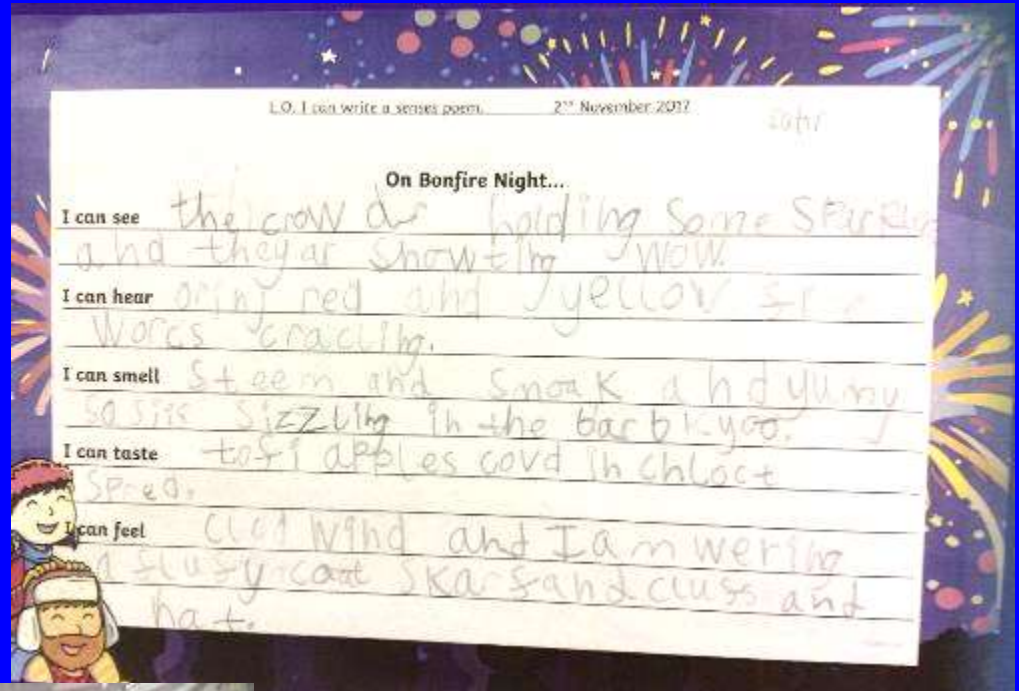

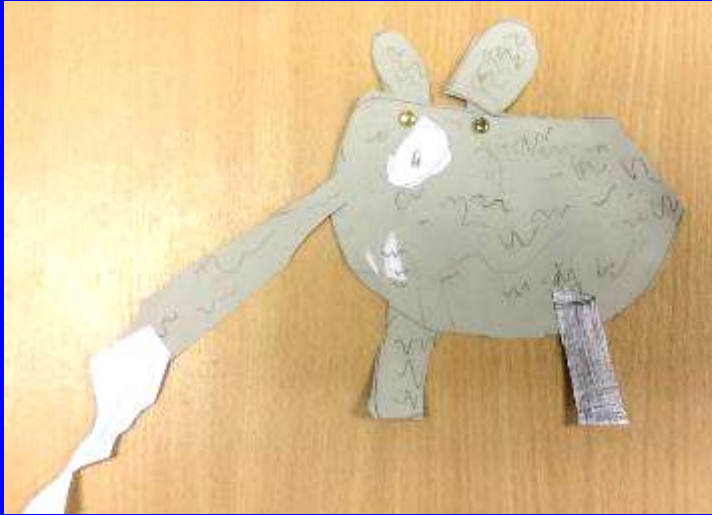
Reception have been making poppies to commemorate Remembrance Day

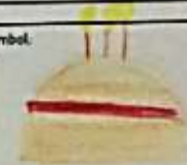

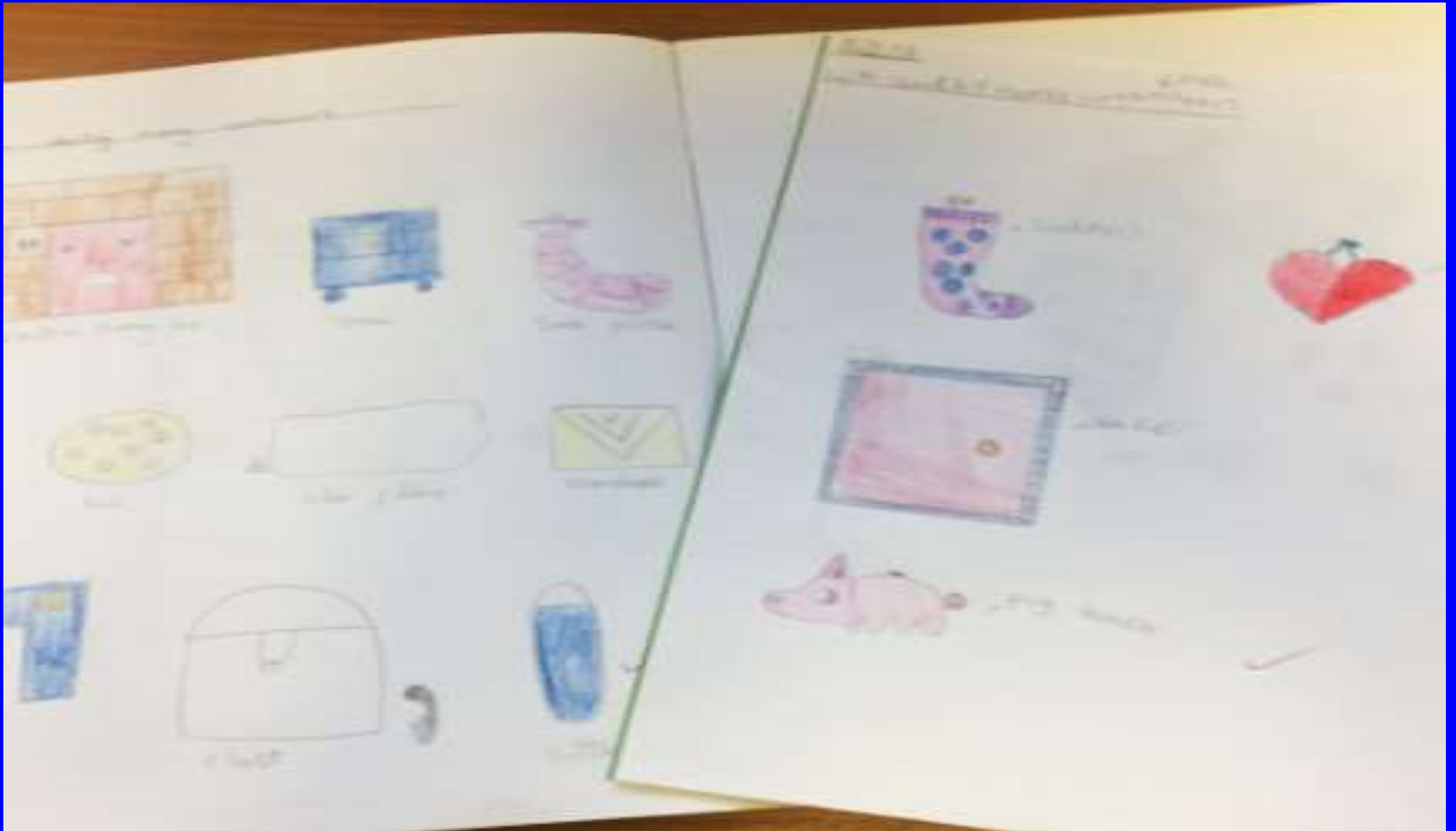
A Dinosaur Encounter

How to find if a number's prime or not

Prime number

First you check if the numbers in the same times tables as the first four prime numbers. The first four prime numbers are 2, 3, 5 and 7. If the numbers not in any of the first four prime number it's a prime number.

If the number is in one of the first four prime numbers times tables it is a composite number.

Next you need to see if it's a multiple of 5. Well the number doesn't end in zero or five so it's still prime for now.

Now the last one we need to check is the 7's $3 \times 7 = 21$ and $4 \times 7 = 28$ see it's not in the 7's

Example 1.
23 It's not a multiple of 2 because it's not even so it's prime for now. Next you need to add 2 and 3 to see if it's a multiple of 3. $2 + 3 = 5$ and it's not a multiple of 3 so the number it still prime for now. The answer is 23 is a prime number.

We went there to experience being a domestic servant in the Victorian era. All of us had to dress up to match our trip. Girls dressed in dresses or aprons and boys wore a shirt and long socks.

Firstly, we entered the servants quarters which was a beer cellar. We propped our selves ~~up~~ against the beer barrels and listened to the cook - Gabitas and the footman - John. I could feel the draft creeping up my spine, it was very chilly in that room as it was one of the lowest rooms in the house.

Next, we went upstairs only to find ourselves in Housekeeper's quarter. To us servants she was known as ma'am. She had introduced herself she then explained, 'Mr and Mrs Edginton, the owners of the house, are away so I have been left in charge.' To me, and I'm sure to many others, this sentence was a game-changer. Already there were rules of how to stand and how to act when somebody important passed. Girls had to stand with their hands in front and boys stood with hands behind. We then split off into separate groups.

In order, we my group trooped off to the still room. The still room is a small kitchen. Gabitas (the cook) then

Children in coal mines

Children worked in coal mines from the age of 4. There were very few safety rules in that place so it was highly unsafe for children to work in those conditions. But many people did it to survive. Younger children were often given the easy yet hard life of a trapper who had to open and close the door for the older children and adults who were the coal bearers. They had to carry heavy amounts of coal on their backs in a basket. Many of the workers had long shifts of up to 13 hours a day while others worked less, all spent their hours with a constantly bent back which made this a very hard job to do. Although it was a very hard job to do and cope with it had a high pay of up to 8p daily.
