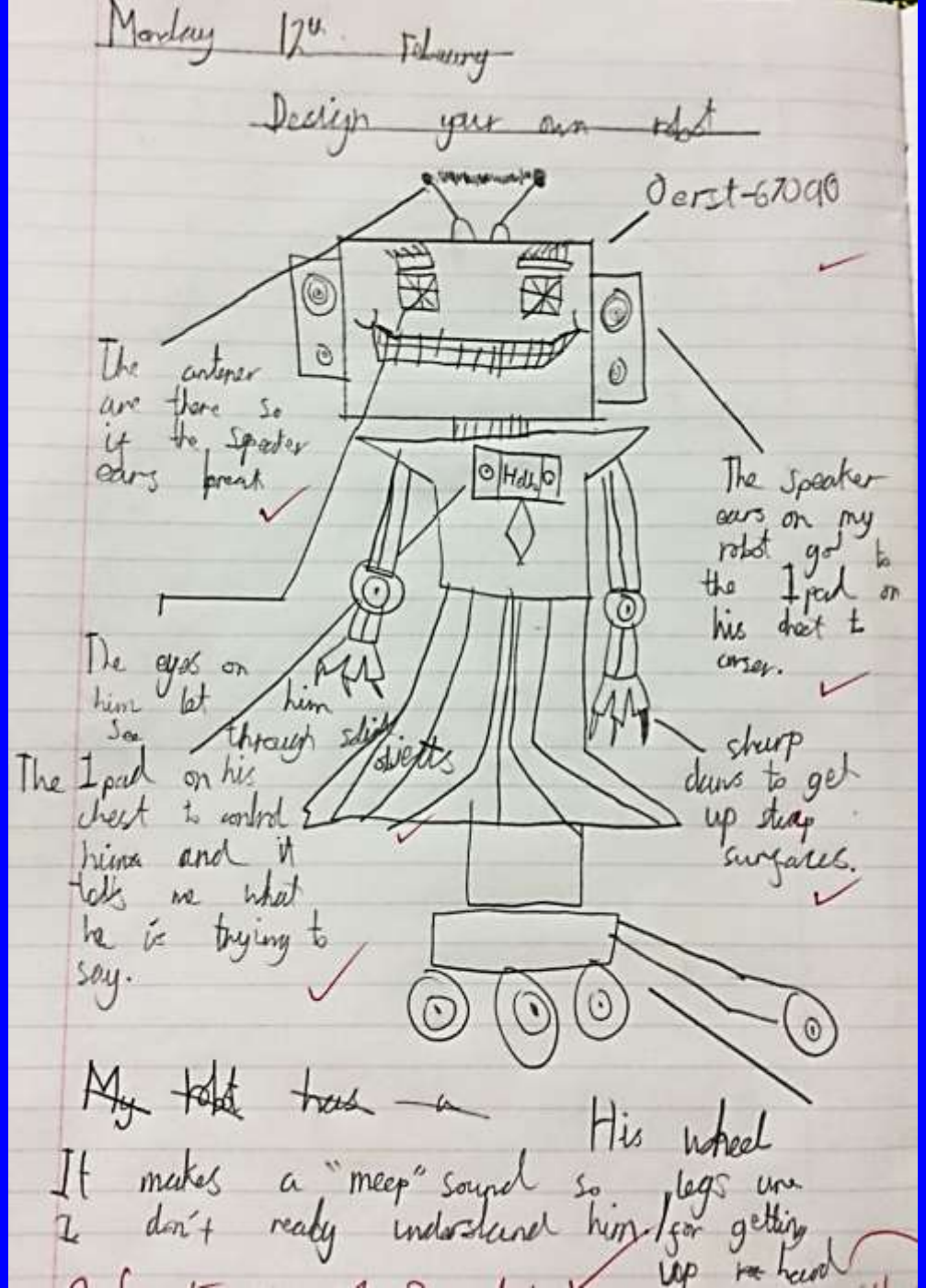
Year 3 - Sam wrote about the day his robot went out of control.

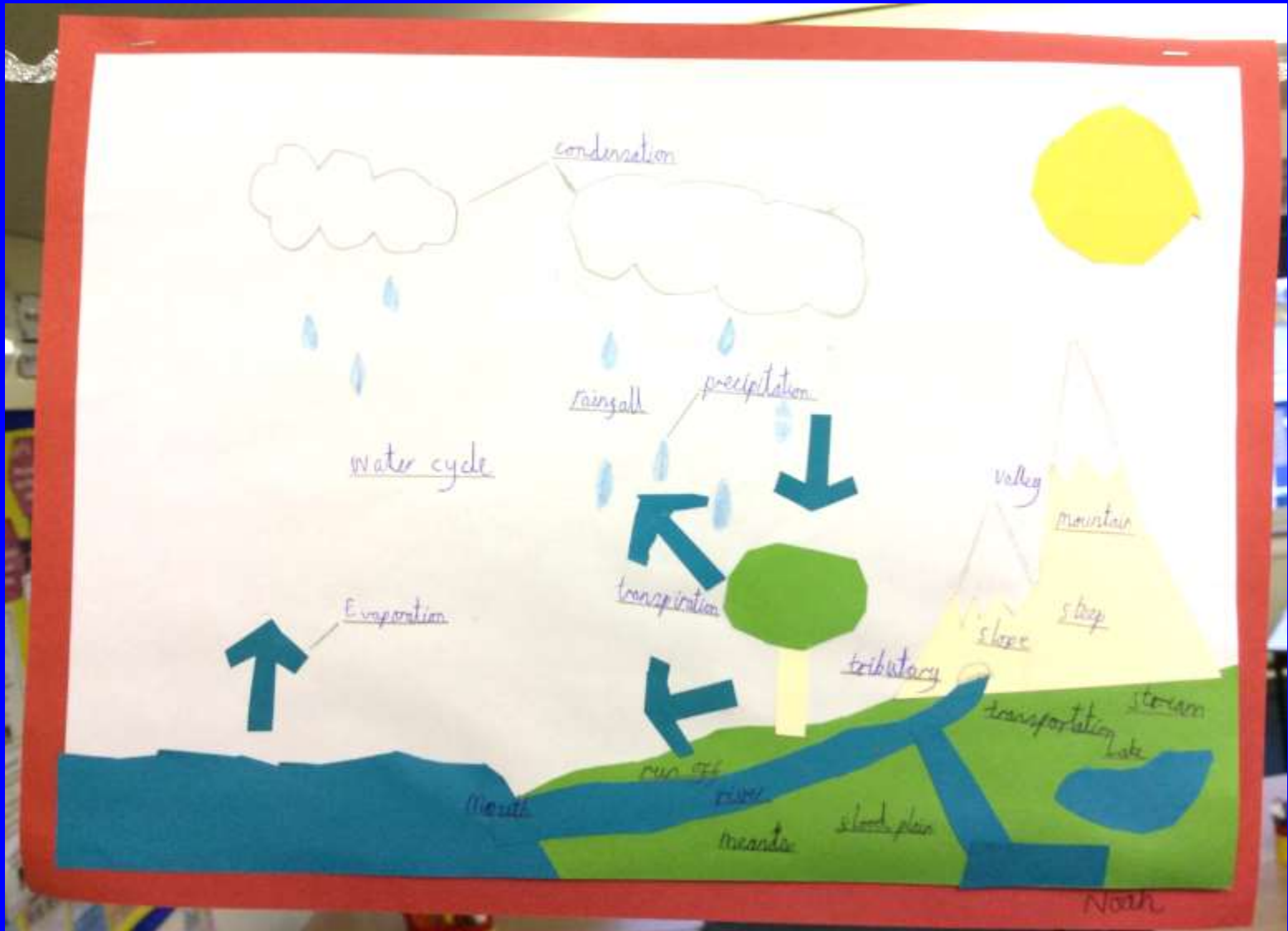

Year 6 Nathan worked well to produce a balanced argument about who was to blame for the sinking of the Lusitania in WW1

The Lusitania (a British cruise liner) was sailing back from New York to Liverpool. Unfortunately, the Lusitania had been torpedoed, causing 1119 passengers to die out of the 1959 passengers aboard, causing 111 Americans to die out of the 128 aboard the boat. Many women and children had died from this event. Now we will consider whose fault it was for the sinking of the Lusitania, and how it had happened.

Firstly, Germans could be blamed for killing many innocent passengers including children and babies aboard the Lusitania. This is also breaking the international law of killing blameless passengers aboard the Lusitania. The worst part is that the Germans knew the amount of people who climbed onto the Lusitania. So when they fired, they had submerged the Lusitania into the Ocean, once they had completed the sinking they had earned medals for completing their mission.

The Lusitania, a Cunard cruise liner, set sail on the 1st of May 1915. Almost a week into its journey from New York to Liverpool it was torpedoed at 2:10 in the afternoon and most passengers were having lunch at the time without knowing a thing about the U-boat lurking in the waters below.

Firstly, the Germans murdered around 300 innocent children, not just the 8781 adults that also died. On the other hand, Britain had been warned that any ship sailing while flying a British flag is liable to destruction. This warning was blatantly ignored by the British and her allies.

In addition to this, the Germans had ordered 15 U-boats equipped with torpedoes to patrol the ~~the~~ British waters. Nevertheless, the ~~the~~ Lusitania was to fast for U-boats which were also supposed to be in the English channel at the time.

On the other hand, sinking the Lusitania broke several international laws which didn't help the Germans at all but it did help the shock of how horrible the Germans were spread round the globe.
