Year 1 have been designing flying carpets. They had to choose a country where their carpet would take them and use the colours of that country's flag, and features from that country, as inspiration.

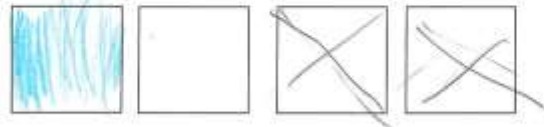

4. What can be done if our teeth rot and fall out?

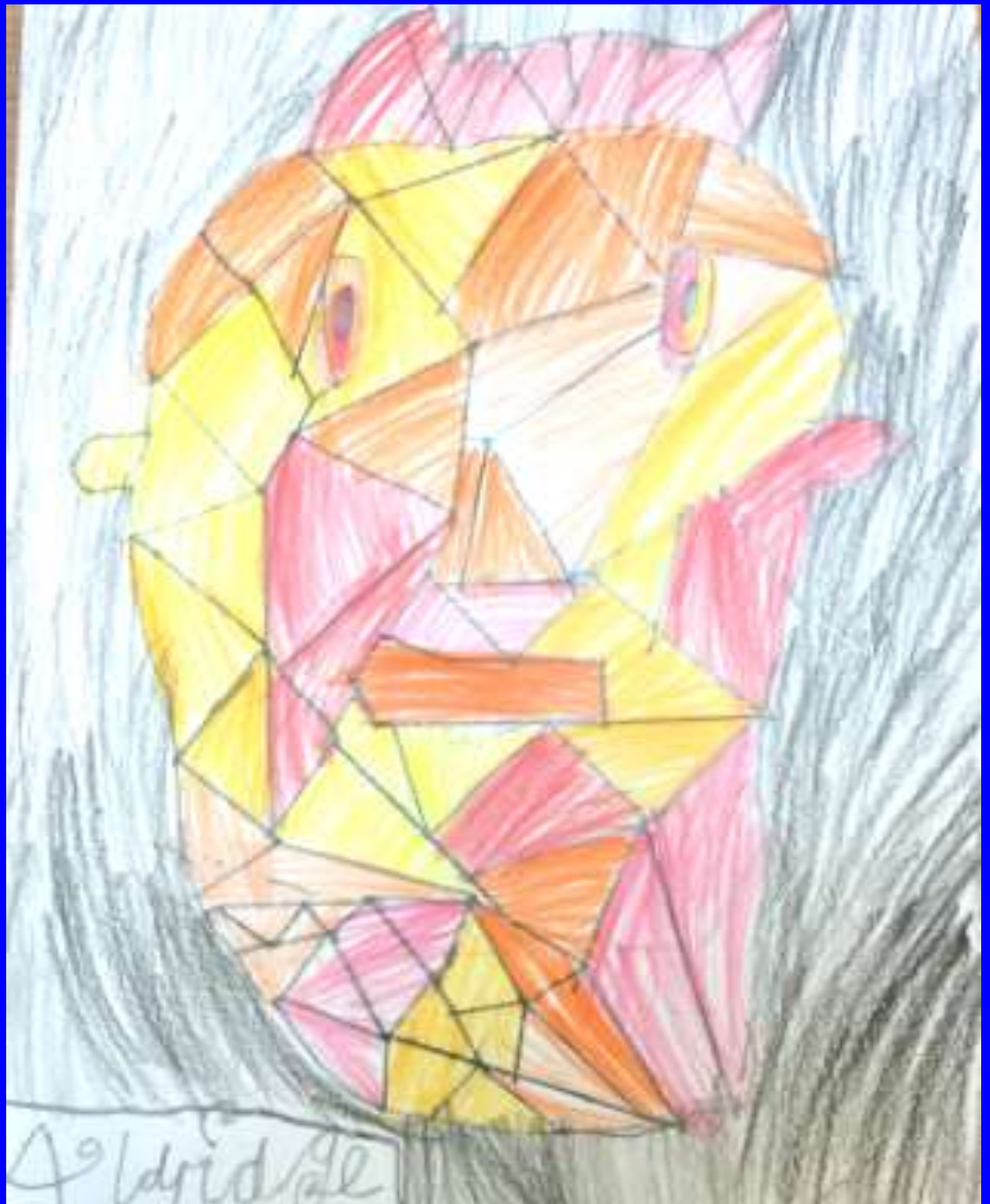
Dentists can put false teeth in your mouth or they can use fillings or ~~own~~ take ~~the~~ teeth.
